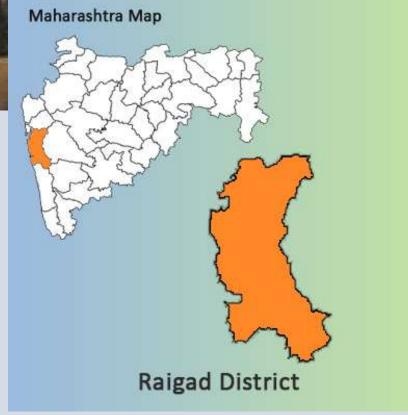


# DISTRICT STRATEGIC PLAN RAIGAD



### Vision

• The district of Raigad being one of the most crucial coastal districts of the state with significant economic edges in terms of the large prevalence of Industry, logistics (Roads, Ports, and Airport), fishing, tourism, horticulture, and GI Tagging, and economically crucial services sectors besides its longest coastline and the advantage of the Oceanic Economy in the state of Maharashtra aspires to attain the faster and inclusive growth trajectory and to reach at the economic heights of 186367 crore in 2027-28 from its present level GDDP of 53008 crore in 2021-22.

### Growth Sub-sectors identified for economic growth

	Primary Sector
Agricultural and Horticultural crops	To increase the production of agricultural crops in the district by using the modern technology along with traditional agriculture. Emphasis on GI tagged white onion production from perspective of export.
Fisheries	To Enhance the freshwater and brackish water fish production of the district of through modern fishing methods.

Building and construction industry	Due to the strategic location of the district from the city like Mumbai, the building and construction industry have rising demand in the district.
